

Literary Analysis Paragraphs: Color Coding Assessment

Save a fresh copy of your literary analysis paragraph and then code the copy. This step ensures that you will still have a “clean” copy to work on later.

Color-code your paragraph according to the instructions below.

Please note that some text may require multiple coding indicators.

- ¶TS/Claims:**
 - Highlight in red the analytical [C→E] claim of the paragraph in the ¶TS and the final concluding sentence that restates the ¶TS.
- Textual Evidence:**
 - Change the font color to blue for all the evidence in the form of direct quotations from the text.
 - Select all of the language that provides narrative contexts (what’s happening in the narrative) framing your quotations and change the font color to green.
- Reasoning:**
 - Italicize the font to indicate language that reveals meaning by explaining the ways in which the evidence supports the central claim.*
 - Identify the use of **literary terms** by rendering the font bold.
 - Select all language that reveals the effects of the literary terms by highlighting it in yellow.
- Style:**
 - Highlight all **transition words** using the bright green highlighter.
 - If the ¶TS includes a strong verb (not “to be” or other linking verbs) underline the verb.
